Facebook page turns a thousand



It is encouraging to see an organisation resisting peer pressure to use supplementary information in stones and pounds for body weight and feet and inches for personal height. They are complying with the law and appear confident that customers will understand this information despite the strong tradition and custom to use imperial units for body weight and height."

UKMA report entitled "Still a mess"

In 2013, UKMA commissioned YouGov to carry out a survey of public understanding of the use of metric and imperial units and of public support for completing the metric changeover. A follow-up survey also examined the salience of metrication as a political issue.

The survey showed that, although younger people were more supportive of completing the metric changeover than older people, 36% of the 18 to 24 age group were opposed. And, although there was a definite association between age and acceptance of metric units, there was a large minority, or perhaps even a majority, of young people who habitually use imperial rather than metric units for everyday functions.

The report, subtitled "The continuing failure of UK Measurement policy", includes the full results of the opinion survey, and is now available on UKMA's main web site: https://ukma.org.uk/still-a-mess/

"A very British mess"

The predecessor of "Still a mess" is a 62-page report published by UKMA in 2004, which described the UK's measurement muddle, outlined its consequences, and pointed a way out of the mess. It included a foreword by the late Lord Howe of Aberavon, and appendices detailing the experiences of other countries that had recently made the metric changeover.
